

ANGELS BASEBALL



On this behind-the-scenes tour of Angel Stadium, you'll get a whole new perspective of one of our nation's most historic ballparks and home to the 2002 World Series Champions!

Angel Stadium is baseball's fourth-oldest active Major League Baseball stadium, behind Fenway Park, Wrigley Field, and Dodger Stadium. You will be invited to view areas that are normally restricted to the public. Highlights of this 75-minute tour may include: A trip down to the field at Angel Stadium, A visit into the Angels Dugout, walk through the Visitors' Clubhouse, A close up look at the Mike Scioscia interview room, An exclusive look at the Gene Autry Suite, Broadcasting booth, the Press Conference room, as well as a Dugout Suite

Foodie fans will definitely be excited with our lunch stop at the 1919 Anaheim Packing House. This is a full-fledged culinary walkabout experience. This old citrus packing house has been converted into a collection of more than two dozen small restaurants housed on two floors. The food choices are wonderfully eclectic with an emphasis on local, sustainable and/or organic ingredients: a grilled cheese bar, crepe shop, a fish grill and a gourmet popsicle shop. Terrariums hang from the high ceiling like a spider's web, the structures of the shops look like they're made from reclaimed wood, steel beams cover the space. Enjoy lunch on your own.

We will then visit Southern California's oldest court building. From its dedication in 1901, this granite and sandstone building has been the traditional home of county government. Today the 30,000-square foot building has been restored to look much as it had at the turn of the last century. The building is on the National Register of Historic places and is a State of California Historic Landmark and a wonderful slice of Orange County history.
