



We begin this memorable day with an included lunch at Ruby's Diner. Located at the site of the original Santa Fe depot built in 1888, the 1938-era building has been transformed into a show-stopping venue showcasing a wealth of nostalgic elements – from a model train that travels cross-country through a diorama of America, to an array of artwork that pays homage to Orange's historic citrus and railroad industries.

Next, we venture to the Hilbert Museum for a docent-guided tour of the museum. This is the nation's only institution dedicated to the display of California Scene painting and California representational art. The Hilbert Collection – which includes oils, watercolors, sketches and lithographs of rural and urban scenes, coastal views, farms, ranches, freeways and landscapes of everyday life in the Golden State and features a who's who of 20th century California masters.

Lastly, you will have 2 options to explore. Option 1; "Old Town Orange." Commonly referred to as "The Orange Circle". Old Town Orange is a one square-mile area that is centered on the historic Orange Plaza and is considered the heart of the City of Orange. It features the best antique shopping, second hand stores and gourmet eateries. It has the distinction of being the largest historic district in California and has many structures listed on the National Registry of Historic Places. Option 2; Visit the California's Gold Exhibit and Huell Howser Archives.

Experience the joy that the late TV legend Huell Howser shared with generations of Californians at the permanent exhibit, housed in Chapman University. The exhibit includes images, text, and artifacts, which outline Howser's career and legacy in California.
